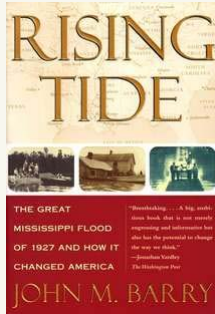
Dr. Dwight Lawson: Deputy Director Of Zoo Atlanta

"to strive to inspire the citizens of Atlanta and Georgia and all visitors to the Zoo to value wildlife on Earth and to help safeguard existing species through conservation". They accomplish this mission by providing an informative, educational, and engaging experience, being respectful and responsible stewards of the animals and the physical and financial assets, and engaging in related conservation activities and research.

Zoo Atlanta has a well-developed Behavioral Research Program on zoo grounds, as well as Field Conservation Projects in South America, Africa, and Asia. There is currently a major effort to save frogs in Latin America. Zoo Atlanta's research and conservation programs are supported by private donations and by funds from outside sources such as the National Geographic Society, the National Science Foundations, and Conservation International.

The zoo is Atlanta's oldest cultural institution, dating back from 1889. It receives 700,000 guests annually. It also receives 70,000 school visits a year. It has a 14.3 million dollar economic impact on the city of Atlanta and it operates on an 11.5 million dollar annual budget.

Zoo Atlanta is located at 800 Cherokee Ave. SE, Atlanta, GA, 30315 and can be reached by calling 404-624-WILD or by visiting www.zooatlanta.org. Zoo Atlanta is open 363 days a year - it is closed only on Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day. General admission is \$19.99 (for adults) and \$14.99 (for children ages 3 to 11, children 2 and under are free!) For volunteering information, please visit www.zooatlanta.org/home/volunteer.
